### Recommendations

## A. Enjoy

- a. Maintain the possibility for enjoyment, awe, and wonder.
- b. Remember: Children should be plunged into the world created by the story.

#### B. Slow Down

- a. How many students are confused simply because we read too quickly?
- b. Less is more; read fewer stories, and read them well; make them "stick"

#### C. Pre-teach Words\*

- a. Which words?
  - i. Important words
  - ii. Frequent words
  - iii. Confusing words
  - iv. Interesting/unusual words

### D. Ask Questions\*

- a. Focus on key passages
  - i. Transitions
  - ii. Changes
  - iii. Growth
  - iv. Decisions

## E. Model Thinking\*

a. Let the students hear what a mature reader does while reading.

### F. Write\*

a. Focus on summarizing key points.
